Gifts to the Library

The Library appreciates and receives a wide range of material gifts that enhance the University's teaching and research mission. Such gifts can include books, journals, manuscripts, archives, maps, memorabilia, still and moving images, sound recordings, microform, sculptures, paintings and other forms of art. Equipment, furniture, technology and musical instruments are also considered.

Gifts are evaluated primarily in light of their relevance to the teaching and research mission and also to the role of the University as a regional comprehensive university. Some collections of international interest are also acquired.

Depending upon the subject matter and material type, gifts also will be evaluated in accordance with their physical condition.

The Library encourages financial gifts to create endowments, make planned gifts or provide one time or ongoing support for the collection, the facility, exhibits, services or programs.
