4. Demonstrated proficiency searching online databases.
5. Excellent oral, written, and interpersonal communication skills.

Desired:

6. Library instruction or teaching experience.
7. Strong service commitment.
8. Knowledge of current trends and issues in academic librarianship.
9. Experience with development of online research guides.
10. Experience in creating digital learning objects.
11. Willingness to serve as needed in a range of library duties, which may include reference and instructional services to a specific subject discipline or program area.
12. Ability to work nights and weekends as needed.
