HSCI 511: Introduction Health Administration Library Resources

Assignment for HSCI 511 is due October 2, 2014. Assignment is worth 10 points of your grade.

You may be wondering, "What does the library have to do with health administration?" Well, what if I told you that this assignment will prepare for future assignments in this classes and in other classes in your graduate program? In healthcare you will be constantly investigating. For instance, you might be looking for innovative strategies; maybe looking back at historical documents; or maybe checking out census reports to back up your business plan. This "investigation" is called research. In this teaching lab, our Health Sciences Librarian, Mrs. Marcia Henry, will provide an overview of the information resources available through Oviatt Library and how to access them; she will teach you how to begin a search and use keywords to refine your search; and show you how to give credit where credit is due by using the APA Citation Style (to avoid literary theft!). "

To receive full credit for this assignment you must attend the full library session with the class and correctly complete the following exercise.

Instructions:

Chapter 2 of Olden and Chapter 5 of Goldsmith provide an overview of the roles of managers, the traditional and current perspectives of the work of managers, and the knowledge, skills, and attitudes of successful managers. In recent years the role of cultural competence in successful management has been extensively researched and a large body of literature related to cultural competence is available.

Scholarly Journals (Peer-reviewed/Referreed)


- Authors are authorities in their fields.
- Authors cite their sources in endnotes, footnotes, or bibliographies.
- Individual issues have little or no advertising.
- Articles must go through a [peer-review](#) or refereed process.
- Articles are usually reports on scholarly research.
- Illustrations usually take the form of charts and graphs.
- Articles use jargon of the discipline.



Complete the following:

1. (2 points) Locate FOUR (4) references on cultural competence in the health management and/or health sciences databases.
 - a. TWO (2) of the references must come from peer-reviewed articles (A scholarly and/or refereed article is one published in a periodical that requires blind review and approval of the articles prior to publication).
 - b. ONE (1) of the references must come from a book.
 - c. ONE (1) of the references can come from a source of your own choosing
2. (3 points) Cite your sources on a references page, and use the American Psychological Association (APA) style to cite the reference page. The American Psychological Association website provides a tutorial and guidance on using the APA style of citation, and web resources for citation will be covered in the lab session. There are also samples posted on Moodle. Remember that different sources are referenced differently. For instance, books are referenced in a way that's different from a website or a newspaper article.

OneSearch

OneSearch allows you to search, at this time, 150 databases as well as the Oviatt Library catalog. Although 150 databases, many indexes (e.g. PubMed, PsycInfo, Physical Education Index, LLBA...), full text databases (e.g. ScienceDirect, Sage Journals, JSTOR, Springer, Taylor & Franics...) are a lot of databases, OneSearch does NOT contain the contents of all our databases yet. **OneSearch** does offer a consistent way to save the records you want to keep, and if you view your saved records, on the right there is a "Export to EndNoteWeb" command where you can easily send the bibliographic information on the source you are viewing into your personal (editable) citation management database.

OneSearch is very useful to look up scholarly article citations (use quick keyword search author surname key words in title, or type in the article Doi if your citation offers a Doi), or do a simple keyword search on topic. You can identify academic articles easily, often be advised article is "peer reviewed" and see lots of hints on other keywords you can use for your search strategy.

Citing your sources EndNote Web

- Learn how to sign up and use **Endnote Web** . You can import bibliographic records from a variety of resources to create your own personal database of articles, books, websites. Use [EndNote Web](#) to collect, manage, and create a bibliography or works cited list from your citations.

Registration is free while you are a student. First time, to sign up for your EndNoteWeb account, you can connect directly to


