Course Description

In this course, we will work to gain a greater understanding of your role and responsibility in creating and consuming information, in navigating the changing dynamics of the world of information, and in the ethical use of information.

Course assignments and activities will help you foster enhanced engagement with the core ideas about information and the variation in disciplinary scholarship. We will ask ourselves broad questions about why information is valuable, how it is constructed and commodified, and how it can be used to marginalize or privilege communities of knowledge and practice.
