About the Department

The California State University, Northridge, Oviatt Library provides educational, cultural, and information services and resources to the students and faculty. Its primary mission is to support and supplement classroom and independent learning; facilitate student and faculty research; and provide students with lifelong skills in identifying, locating, evaluating, and synthesizing information. Specialized service areas include a music and media center, assistive technology labs, special collections and archives, teacher's curriculum center, and student access computer labs containing more than 300

workstations, laptops, and tablets. Current Library faculty and staff include approximately 25 tenure-track full-time librarians and 60 full-time paraprofessionals. The Library Systems Group deploys, manages and supports faculty, staff and student equipment and software in offices and labs. The mission of Web Services is to support student access to library electronic resources and services and to facilitate the instructional activities of both the librarians and the external teaching faculty. Web Services manages a dozen production and development/testing servers, including two production Drupal instances and locally hosted databases; and also develops, enhances and maintains interfaces that support user access to library resources and faculty library instruction.

Major Duties

Under direct supervision of the Web Services Coordinator, the Web Programmer provides support for the web and mobile presence of the Oviatt Library. Installs, configures, and maintains web-based and mobile applications; assists in the design and development of new mobile and web-based applications; processes digital audio and video media, and provides support for multimedia content distribution; automates routine tasks, writes and documents scripts, and identifies areas in need of changes; conducts periodic testing, and recommends improvements; provides support to other members of the Web Services team as needed; prepares work for presentation to Library stakeholders. Works on special projects, and performs other duties as assigned.

Qualifications

Equivalent to graduation from an accredited four-year college or university in a related field. Certification training and applied experience may be substituted for the required education, on a year-for-year basis up to two years. Equivalent to six months of full-time, progressively responsible experience with website and web application programming.

Knowledge, Skills, & Abilities

Knowledge of programming and testing methods and techniques for web-based applications, using industry standard application programming languages and systems analysis techniques. Demonstrated proficiency using current web programming languages and platforms such as PHP, MySQL, CSS3, HTML 5, Javascript libraries, JSON/XML; thorough knowledge of PC/MAC based web browsers and related tools. Competency configuring and editing content for a database-driven content management system such as Drupal. Ability to work both independently and in a team-based environment; analyze problems and propose effective solutions; understand functional and procedural requirements, and develop alternative solutions; relate solutions to management, technical staff, and users; communicate effectively both orally and in writing; establish and maintain effective working relationships with others. Candidate must possess meticulous attention to detail and excellent communication skills. Preferred: Working knowledge of usability testing protocols and web accessibility (compliance with Section 508 of the Americans with Disabilities Act).
