
Databases

PubMed (related to MEDLINE)

Medline is also available to **CSUN** throughthe ISI Web of Knowledge and the Ovid interfaces.

Scholarly Journals (Peerreviewed/Referreed)

- Authors are authorities in their fields
- · Authors cite their sources in endnotes. footnotes, or bibliographies.



- · Individual issues have little or no advertising.
- Articles must go through a peer-<u>review</u> or refereed process.
- · Articles are usually reports on scholarly research.
- Illustrations usually take the form of charts and graphs.
- Articles use jargon of the discipline.

Formatting Citations

This tab contains citation guidelines and examples in both APA and MLA style formats, along with links to other styles and resources on citation styles. The style you should use is usually determined by the discipline or course in which you are working. Ask your instructor what style s/he requires or recommends.

Why Cite Sources? Avoiding plagiarism is the most obvious reason; it also helps you back up your arguments with credible evidence and allows others to track down the same resources.

Before turning in your paper, check for these common citation errors:



OneSearch

Citing your sources EndNote Web

Learn how to sign up and use
 Endnote Web. You can import
 bibliographic records from a variety
 of resources to create your own
 personal database of articles, books,
 websites. Use EndNote Web to
 collect, manage, and create a
 bibliography or works cited list from
 your citations.

Registration is free while you are a student. First time, to sign up for your EndNoteWeb account, you can connect directly to

. In addition to asking Marcia Henry and other librarians for help, Endnote Web will also answer your questions about installing the Cite While you Write plugin for Microsoft Word on your own computer. If you install Cite While You Write plugin on your own computer in your MicroSoft Word, be sure to set Preferences so it goes to the url:

on your own computer you can put in the working email address you used to sign up with EndNoteWeb, your password, and check Keep me logged in.

JSTOR, Springer, Taylor & Franics...) are a lot of databases, OneSearch does NOT contain the contents of all our databses yet. **OneSearch** does offer a consistent way to save the records you want to keep, and if you view your saved records, on the right there is a "Export to EndNoteWeb" command where you can easily send the bibliographic information on the source you are viewing into your personal (editable) citation management database.

OneSearch is very useful to look up scholarly article citations (use quick keyword search author surname key words in title, or type in the article Doi if your citation offers a Doi), or do a simple keyword search on topic. You can identify academic articles easily, often be advised article is "peer reviewed" and see lots of hints on other keywords you can use for your search strategy.



Overview | HSCI 436 Assignment

Assignment:

Health Issue Paper and Presentation – (8 page minimum, 20 minute maximum) In groups of three, prepare a research paper and presentation on any teacher approved health issue. Paper must have a minimum of **four (4)peer review articles and be in APA format**. Presentation of research should be simple, concise and in an interesting manner with all group members contributing. Be creative, use visuals, video clips, activities, any media that will help classmates retain the information.

Possible topics include:

- Alcohol Use,
- Tobacco Use.
- Substance Use,
- Eating Disorders,
- Bullying,
- Obesity,
- · Physical Education,
- · Teen Pregnancy,
- Sports Safety,
- Sex Education,
- · Depression,
- Self-Mutilation (this is not an all-inclusive list; you may create your own topic).

Research

Under individual headings/ sub-headings research

- 1. description of health issue and effect on adolescents
- 2. prevalence of health issue
- 3. co-occurring issues
- 4. risk and protective factors
- 5. warning signs
- 6. screenings and assessments
- 7. example of a prevention program for this health issue (including structure, content and delivery), and 8
- 8. conclusion.


